Council will vote to use closed session per Iowa Code Section 21.5(1)(c) to discuss litigation strategy with legal counsel – Garrett made a motion to go into closed session and Painter 2nd. Motion passed with roll call.

Minutes of Last Meeting – Painter made a motion to approve minutes of last meeting and Hogan 2nd.

Motion passed unanimously.

Approve Agenda – Garrett made a motion to approve agenda and Hillman 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report – Garrett made a motion to approve financial report and Hillman 2nd. Motion passed unanimously. Fund balances are as follows: Operating - \$598,239.31, Garbage - \$15,837.34, Fruitland Fun Days - \$-1,780.45, Road - \$63,942.99, LOST Sewer & Water - \$54,169.66, LOST Lawful - \$233,189.08, Iowa Cares Act - \$23,338.77, ARPA - \$146,831.54, Park Activities: Park Improvement - \$41.00 and Park Activities: Shelter - \$33,716.66.

Old Business

Fire Department Update – Chief Henkel reported the following fire calls for October – 8 fire calls with 4 township and 4 auto aid with Muscatine, 10 medical calls with 8 township and 2 city. For November he reported 11 fire calls with 6 township and 2 city, 2 auto aid with Muscatine and 1 mutual aid with Letts, 6 medical calls with 5 township and 1 city. Fire Department is working on their budget and will be having their annual blues and barbeque fest in July next year. He also reported that they need a new brush truck.

Nuisance Abatement – Due to weather City Council will extend abatement to May 1st, 2023 on 101 Second Ave. Painter made this motion and Hogan 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Bike Path Update – Painter reported a price of \$285,000 to provide a bike path from Crimson Ave. to Evergreen Lane from Bolton & Menk. He also reported a price of \$206,000 on Turkey Road and \$240,000 on North St. to city limits. Hills reported that he attended a meeting with Muscatine Trails Group about grants and they meet again in February. Painter will continue working with Bolton & Menk to get firm bid.

Comprehensive Plan Update – City Council would like to see all four maps updated from Bi-State after more research is done to make sure maps are correct.

New Business

Approve LL Pelling Proposal – Painter made a motion to accept LL Pelling proposal and Hogan 2nd. Motion passed unanimously.

Discuss/Approve Purchase of Utility Vehicle – Hogan volunteered to remove snow from City properties a few times until we get bids for snow removal for these areas. Purchasing a utility vehicle will be tabled for now.

Flag Markers for City Right-of-Way- Hills reported that he spoke to Mr. Whitlow from Muscatine and they don't allow any flag markers.

Correspondence – Clerks advised they received a call to plant a memorial tree in honor of Natalie McCleary. This will be discussed in the spring.

Closing Comments – Clerks advised that community center rental info/prices, junk vehicles and Park Board terms were moved to January agenda.
